 (2016)
- 39 were unable to name any of the rights secured by the First Amendment. (2016)
- A 41 could not name the current Vice-President. (2010)
- 64 could not name the three branches of government. (2014)
- column 77 (between the ages of 18 and 34) could not name one of the senators representing their state. (2015)
